

In order to complete a collation assignment for Latin 1abc or Latin 101ab, the easiest thing to do is to copy the Latin of the assignment that is available for you on the webpage. Everything is formatted for you, including spaces, so I don't have to run back through your submission and clean up stuff my software doesn't quite like. You can then simply replace the code "aaa" with the three-letter id tag of your choice (anything is ok except for "cja," which is mine). You'll then replace the Latin text with your translation.

After your assignment is complete, you need to send it to me. Do not send it as an attachment. Send it as the body of an email, with your three-letter id tag in the subject line.

I will collate all assignments submitted to me by the deadline and then post the finished collation of all assignments in a special area for you to access at your leisure.

You will want to evaluate yourself in comparison to the work of your peers. Ask yourself, "Why did they translate with this word?" or "Why did everybody translate that verb as an imperfect except for me?" You will want especially to evaluate yourself in comparison with my archetype. I may make an error, so bring it up to me in class or in an email if you catch a mistake.

Remember to be diligent about your collation assignments. They aren't worth much individually, but they really help out your grade by the end if you've developed the habit of regular work through the week.
